If the mere thought of big uair and perms brings you back o the thought of leg warmers, ou're not alone. It is official hough – the perm is back! But his time around, it is softer nd kinder. It's subtler and all bout waves and volume.

The new wave perm echniques create a more rippled ffect. If your hair is fine, it is nother way to give your hair allness. And yes, with today's

perms you can color and perm and still keep the integrity of your hair. There are groundbreaking perms that are available that address most issues of hair types and conditions.

Now, also very new, is the new curl care. Apart from the chemicals of solutions used in the past, another reason our curls turned to wire was our total lack of hair care.

For best results, keep your new look well moisturized with home and salon treatments.

R e g u l a r professional salon protein treatments

strengthen your hair and intensive conditioners used regularly boost your hair's moisture levels. Use a professional curls shampoo a cheap one can simply strip the hair of necessary oils. You should try not to towel dry your style too much as this can break down the curl and lead to frizz. Instead, gently blot away moisture and comb though with a wide-tooth comb. Washing your hair every second or third day can give your perm extra

Finally, do not over load on product! One of the biggest mistakes made is thinking more product will revive our curls, when in fact it only causes them to drop and make them look duller. Look for lighter products such as curl serums or creams. If your style begins to drop later on, try spritzing on a curl refresher. Remember you are going for defined, controlled, touchable hair, not crunchy.

Now if the perm is not for you and you have some natural wave to your hair then perfect!

The secret to getting the tousled tresses to look right is not to take the trend too literally.

Like all good hair, this style starts with a great cut and actually requires maintenance. Embrace your natural texture and flow, but remember that natural looks best when given a helping hand.

There are many ways to create curls without perming; the one you choose depends on your hair type and the look you are trying to achieve. Use pin curls if you're interested in a retro style. Apply setting lotion to small sections of damp hair and wrap them around your finger, loosely pin into place, then hood dry and release. Opt for hot rollers to get curls to last on straight hair. Larger rollers will create more fullness and body, while smaller ones result in tighter ringlets. Use a curling iron to enhance natural curl after it has been diffused/blown dry. Finger style your hair if you want a natural looking finish. Hair with natural wave or curl or shorter styles benefit most from this technique. After any curling technique, break up curls with your fingers and a little product to define.

Not only are we seeing a return to glamour this year, but we will see some varying styles of the ponytail return, and bangs (fringe) and layers are a must for the softer, wavy, (youthful looking) styles. If you still like the straight look, a full crown flowing into pumped up sides and softly flipped ends is the modern smooth look. For those who are always looking for something different, the other big trend for 2005 are the disconnected asymmetric cuts. Blunt edges are cropping up in the most unexpected places. with very little or no blending. The angle of the cut can range from a gentle slope to extreme.
